Expanding Opportunities for Involvement

To ensure an effective partnership is established with parents, teachers, and students, the following involvement activities will be available to parents:

- Academy MAP meetings will be held with parents. These meetings will be an opportunity for parents to learn about the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP), Missouri Show-Me Standards, and Average Yearly Progress (AYP) Targets.
- A pacing calendar will be provided to monitor what students are learning throughout the year.
- To monitor their students' progress, each quarter parents will receive a mid-quarter report card.
- Highly quality professional development will be held throughout the year to present new strategies, review achievement data, to review researched ideas and resources.
- Parent training sessions will be held with parents to connect learning at school to home in areas such as reading and math.
